

THE PCF GROUP PROVIDES EXTERIOR ARCHITECTURAL FOAM DETAILS TO NEW COUNSELING, DISABLED AND STUDENT HEALTH SERVICES BUILDING AT SAN DIEGO STATE UNIVERSITY

SAN DIEGO — February 15, 2006 — The PCF Group has provided the exterior architectural foam details (see attached photo) for Counseling, Disabled and Student Health Services (CDSHS) Building at San Diego State University, according to Scott Buckley, vice president of marketing for the PCF Group.

According to Buckley, PCF has provided the light weight concrete finished window trim details and belly band molding for the new building. Mirstone Plastering is the plastering contractor. The general contractor is Highland Partnership of Chula Vista. The architects are Delawie Wilkes Rodriguez Barker of San Diego and Chong Partners Architecture of San Francisco. The building will be completed this spring.

The new CDSHS Building will replace the existing Student Health Services building in order to provide state-of-the-art medical services, health education, counseling and disabled student services to an expanding student population and to prepare for future growth in student health services. The CDSHS building will contain approximately 70,000 gross square feet on four floors. The CDSHS facility will face Aztec Walk, the primary east-west pedestrian corridor located on the southern border of the campus. Urgent Care, Imaging, Accommodated Testing and Pharmacy will be located on the first floor. General Medicine will occupy the second floor. The third floor will be devoted to Disabled Student Services, Optometry, Dentistry, Health Promotion, Medical Records and Information Systems. Health Services Administration, Counseling Services, and Conference Rooms will be located on the fourth floor.
